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'Design-for-Sustainability' (DfS) promotes products, services, and systems that deliver positive impacts to society, the environment, and the economy.

In the South-to-South project, DfS educators from Australian and Latin American universities belonging to the Learning-Network-in-Sustainability (LeNS) will jumpstart collaborative relationships in DfS education and research and share expertise and experiences in a twoway knowledge exchange.

LeNS is an association of DfS educators from 125 higher-education institutions in 27 countries, working to diffuse sustainability capacity through innovative curriculum development, in the hope that the next generation of designers would be equipped with the knowledge-base to aid in the transition towards more sustainable futures.

South-to-South activities include

'South-to-South' Student Workshop Series. Practical DfS activities to prepare students to design enabling solutions to achieve the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

'South-to-South' Educators' Symposium Series. Sharing pedagogical experiences on DfS teaching and learning.

'South-to-South' Collaboration Dialogue Series. Roundtable meetings to explore collaborative publications, joint industry projects and exchange of educators and students.

Activating Australian-Latin-American Cooperation through Sustainable Design Education This half-day symposium will bring together Design-for-Sustainability educators to share and learn from each other's pedagogical experiences in teaching DfS to undergraduate and postgraduate audiences. Participants are invited to make short 15-minute presentations of the DfS briefs that they challenge their students with in their courses, and images of the project outcomes from students. These presentations will be compiled as proceedings into a multimedia e-book and shared pm the LeNS website for free downloading. As a learning community of DfS educators, participants will discuss teaching and learning strategies that could engage and inspire design students to actively contribute to more sustainable futures, such as through international online studio activities. Also in the agenda is a proposed South-to-South Interuniversity Design Challenge, where students from South-to-South institutions will collaborate as multi-national teams to formulate solutions for the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. Lunch and refreshments will be provided during the symposium. Attendees will receive certificates of participation.

Activating Australian-Latin-American Cooperation through Sustainable Design Education Face-to-face roundtable meetings between LeNS-Oceania and LeNS-South-America counterparts will be held in each host university. Participants are invited to make short presentations of their current and past research projects on various aspects of Design for Sustainability, especially on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. The meetings will be audio/video recorded and shared amongst LeNS members within the unlisted YouTube channel of LeNS South-to-South, thereby allowing absent colleagues to listen to the proceedings, contribute comments or ask questions. The dialogues are expected to initiate future cooperative research activities, discuss joint international studio teaching, joint industry projects, co-generation of didactic materials, co-authored publications, international mobility exchange, co-supervision of higher-degree-research students.

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This full-day workshop engages undergraduate and postgraduate design students in collaborative problem-solving activities, centered around mini challenges on Design for Sustainability. In particular, the workshop intends to build creative confidence and capabilities amongst young designers into making modest contributions that could help achieve the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG). Participants are expected to have attended the South-to-South Keynote Lecture scheduled earlier during the event week, which will inspire them with innovative ideas and case studies on existing and emerging SDG solutions from around the world, and how some of these were able to foster behavioral change in society. Students will be grouped into collaboration teams and assigned different SDG challenges to work on. Teams will make short PowerPoint presentations of their design ideas at the end of the workshop; laptops are required, preferably with Wi-Fi connection. Workshop outcomes will be published at the website of LeNS International and attendees will receive certificates of participation. Lunch and refreshments will be supplied throughout the workshop.
